A teacher can give feedback in three d... should check all of them (numbers 1 to capture):

1. A possible **grade** is located in the upper corner. This grade can also be found in MyCourses inbox.

2. Check that the **feedback written or shown**: a **black icon** = instructor feedback, a **blue icon** = instructor feedback layer. To see feedback, click it in order to see feedback.

2.1 Click a speech bubble to see a comment. Numbers 2.1.1 - 2.1.2. in the next screen.

2.2 Some parts can be crossed out from the document.

2.3 Some comments can be seen straight in the document.

2.4 A teacher might have highlighted parts of the document with a bubble comment next to it.

3. Click the blue speech bubble to see the whole document. *Instructor feedback* right. See also numbers 3.1.-3.3. in an other screen below.

4. If a teacher has highlighted parts of the document you can temporarily hide similarity color (see screen capture) by clicking the icon of the similarity layer (number 4). A **red icon** = similarity layer is visible, a **black icon** = similarity layer is hidden.

5. You can *download* a pdf file of your feedback put together apart from a page.

- check that the *instructor feedback* (number 2 = blue). To include the pdf as well, check that the *similar* (number 4 = red)
- choose *Current View* in a pop-up window.

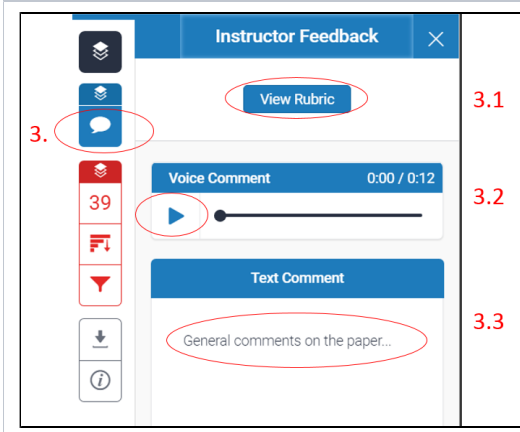
